Hon'ble Vice Chancellor's Message

The union cabinet has approved the new crop insurance scheme *Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana* (PMFBY) - a path breaking scheme for farmers' welfare with an objective to provide insurance coverage and financial support to the farmers in the event of failure of any of the notified crop as a result of natural calamities, pests & diseases, to stabilize the income of farmers to ensure their continuance in farming, to encourage farmers to adopt innovative and modern agricultural practices, and to ensure flow of credit to the agriculture sector. The new scheme will replace the existing two schemes *National Agricultural Insurance Scheme* (NAIS) and Modified NAIS. The scheme will come into force from the *Kharif* season

starting from June -2016. Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi on February 18, 2016 launched the guidelines for operationalization of the *Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana*. The guidelines were issued at a farmers' convention in Sherpur village of Madhya Pradesh.

The Centre currently has a bill of Rs 3,100 crore on account of its share of the premium for the 23 per cent crops that are currently insured in the country. Once 30 per cent of the crop comes under insurance cover, the Centre's financial liability is estimated to go up to Rs 5,700 crore. This financial liability is expected to touch a whopping Rs 8,800 crore once



the target of bringing 50 per cent crop under insurance is achieved in three years.

Presently, about of 15% of farmers are benefitted by old crop insurance scheme, the new scheme aims to cover 50% farmers. PMFBY is the biggest ever government contribution to crop insurance started from *kharif* 2016 season. Farmers have to pay the lowest ever single premium rate for each season on all food grains, oilseeds and pulses - removing all the variations in rates across crops and districts within season. For *kharif* and *rabi* crops, the premium have to be paid up to 2% and 1.5% of the sum insured, respectively, while for annual commercial and horticultural crops, premium would be paid up to 5 per cent of the sum insured. The remaining share of premium to be paid equally by the central and respective state governments. There will be no capping of the sum insured; the farmers will get full insurance cover. Apart from yield loss, the new scheme covering post-harvest losses also. It also provided the farm level assessment for localized calamities including hailstorms, unseasonal rains, landslides and inundation. The scheme proposes mandatory use of remote sensing, smart phones and drones for quick and accurate assessment and settlement of crop loss.

Technology and Machinery Demonstration Fair

The first global DNA barcode report and the first DNA barcode report from India for marine fishes of Gujarat

The Department of Aquaculture, College of Fisheries Science, JAU, Veraval in collaboration with Department of Biotechnology, JAU, Junagadh has achieved a great feat in the form of the first global DNA barcode report for the marine fish Lepidocephalus thermalis. It is the matter of pride that the DNA barcode of L. thermalis has been generated and reported for the first time in the world by the JAU team. Moreover, the DNA barcodes of 10 marine fishes have been generated and reported for the first time from India, as confirmed by the international BOLD Database, Canada. This research work is reported by the research team led by Dr. S. I. Yusufzai, Associate Professor & Head, Dept of Aquaculture, Dr. R. S. Tomar, Dr. M. V. Parakhia, and team of Dept of Biotechnology, with essential support from Dr. B. A. Golakia, Prof. & Head, Dept of Biotechnology, JAU, Junagadh and Dr. A. Y. Desai, Principal & Dean, CoF, Veraval, and Director of Research, JAU, Junagadh. Till date, the College of Fisheries Science, JAU, Veraval along with Department of Biotechnology, JAU, Junagadh have barcoded nearly 80 species of marine fish from the Veraval coastline of Gujarat state, with entire voucher specimen collection of collected fishes. This work is being carried out with aim to generate DNA barcode database of marine fishes of entire Gujarat coastline, under the research project "Mapping of marine fish biodiversity along the Veraval coast using mtDNA barcoding" funded by Gujarat State Biotechnology Mission, Dept of Science & Technology, Govt. of Gujarat, and plan scheme on "Identification and documentation of marine fish biodiversity using mtDNA barcoding at College of Fisheries, JAU, Veraval.

Cow Urine (Gaumutra): Astonishing Research Findings.

Team of researchers of Food Testing Laboratory, JAU, Junagadh consisting Shraddha Bhatt, Manoj Parakhia, Amisha Patel, Bindu Goswami, Rohit Bhalara and led by Dr. B. A. Golakia found astonishing features of cow urine and panchgavya, described briefly as below.

- Gir cow urine has antifungal activity towards Fusarium, Helminthosporium, S. rolofsii, A. flavus and Macrophomina, causing various diseases in crop plants.
- It has also anti-microbial role against human pathogenic bacteria like Salmonella typhi, Vibrio cholerae, E.coli, S. aureus which cause human diseases like Thyphoid, Cholera, Diarrhoea, vomiting and skin diseases.
- Gir cow urine has antimicrobial and antifungal activity which Jafrabadi buffalo and Jersey cow urine doesn't have.
- Panchagavya (concoction of Three direct products: Cow's dung, Cow's urine, cow's milk; Two derived products: curd and cow's ghee) described in Veda were scientifically studied.
- This concoction enchances growth and yield of crop.
- Higher load of bacterial culture was observed in Panchagavya (1.5x10°cfu/ml) compared to other organic preparations, seaweeds and banana sap.
- Panchagavya increases soluble phosphate and converts potash into mobilized form which results in reduction in cost and consumption of these fertilizers.
- Panchagavya enhances germination in Mungbean.
- Panchagavya protects plant against pathogenic fungi Fusarium, Aspergillus flavus, Aspergillus niger, S. rolofsii, Helminthosporium and Macrophomina.


