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
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From the Vice Chancellor's Desk

Reimagining Agri-Education Through the Sixth Deans' Committee Blueprint

Agriculture remains the cornerstone of India's economy, sustaining more than half the population. As India's global economic stature rises, strengthening the national agricultural education system becomes a strategic imperative. Our agricultural universities, rooted in India's ancient educational traditions, today serve a triple mandate—education, research, and extension. With a student base of over 1.65 lakh, it is time to modernize and expand this ecosystem to meet the challenges of sustainability, entrepreneurship, and global competitiveness.



A significant milestone in this direction is the Sixth Deans' Committee Report (2021), which brought sweeping reforms in agricultural education. This committee revised undergraduate curricula with a focus on excellence and relevance, aligning it with the National Education Policy (NEP-2020). Key reforms include holistic, skill-based learning, multiple entry-exit options, lateral admissions, and a robust choice-based credit system. For the first time, academic flexibility was combined with experiential learning to make students job-ready and entrepreneurially inclined. The inclusion of new-age courses such as artificial intelligence, machine learning, and robotics reflects a forward-looking approach to education in the digital era. Initiatives like "Deeksharambh" for value-based orientation, industry internships, skill enhancement modules, and an Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) platform aim to ensure that students are not just degree-holders but agile, competent professionals equipped for real-world challenges.

While these curriculum reforms lay a solid foundation, further steps are essential. Introducing agriculture at the school level can inspire youth and bridge the rural-urban knowledge gap. Promoting polytechnic education in agriculture will address the need for skilled manpower. Concurrently, the development of a vibrant startup ecosystem supported by industry and academia can nurture agri-tech innovation. Programs like ICAR's READY, combined with Skill India and Startup India, offer pathways for practical entrepreneurship training to students.

However, quality assurance remains a concern. Unlike veterinary or medical education, agricultural colleges often operate without mandatory accreditation. This must change. Uniform standards in infrastructure, faculty, land, and labs are non-negotiable. Equally vital is continuous capacity building of teachers to adapt to global pedagogical trends and emerging domains.

India must also strive for internationalization. Enhancing infrastructure, easing admission norms, and establishing exchange and dual-degree programs will attract global talent, especially from Asia and Africa.

The path ahead demands synergy between education and research, leveraging technology and policy reforms to create a globally relevant, innovation-driven agricultural education system. The efforts of the Sixth Deans' Committee provide a visionary blueprint, and it is now our collective responsibility to translate it into impactful action.

The International Conference on "Trailblazing Trends in Sustainable Climate-Resilient Precision Agriculture through Artificial Intelligence and Remote Sensing" was organized during January 23-24, 2025, by Centre of Excellence on Soil & Water Management, Research Testing and Training Centre (RTTC), JAU, Junagadh. The conference was inaugurated by Dr. S. N. Jha, Deputy Director General (Agri. Engg.), in the esteemed presence of Dr. V. P. Chovatia, Patron and Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, JAU. Shri N. M. Thakkar, BASF




